



## INTRODUCTION

Youth development is a key driver for poverty eradication and a pre-requisite for the growth of every nation. It is a paradox of our societies that with so many resources, technology, and innovation, poverty has not been eradicated. This is occasioned by high rates of youth unemployment (19.58% - UN International Labour Organization), monumental corruption, uneven distribution of national resources resulting in inequalities in wealth and power, limited access to education, etc. This has taken its toll on youth development in Nigeria. The Corona Virus Pandemic (Covid-19) has put into question all basic transitions. On the other hand, there is an attempt to identify the best ways of entering not just a short period, but a longer era of new normal that young people will have to cope with.

## WHAT WE WANT TO SOLVE

## » Inadequate Human Capital Investment

Human capital investment is one of the key factors in combating high and persistent unemployment and problems of poverty; yet it is on the low side as every average young person wants to acquire success, not minding whether it is legal or not. Other parastatals believe in capital investment which in little or in no way at the long-run is productive.

#### Unemployment

This continues to pose negative influence on the economy and well-being of young people and women. It will over time, if not curbed brings about total demoralization of a country's economy.

### Limited Access to Quality Education


Education remains an inaccessible right for millions of children around the world. More than 72 million children of primary education age are not in school and 759 million adults are illiterates and do not have the awareness necessary to improve both their living conditions and those of their children. From overcrowded classrooms to poor nutrition. Though it is a basic human right, yet in many developing countries, children's access to education especially girls can be limited by numerous factors which includes; language barriers, gender roles and reliance on child labour all stall progress in providing quality education.

## » Low Cognitive Competence of Young People

Cognitive competency's theory and creative thinking skills of an individual facilitate effective problem solving, decision making and learning for positive development. The inability to process these skills by young people has brought about basic societal and economic problems such as violence, financial dependence, among others.

### » Gender-Based Violence

Gender-based violence is an issue faced by people all over the world. Women are disproportionately harmed by gender-based violence. Despite being so prevalent, gender-based violence is largely under reported because of stigma and lack of access to resources and support systems. While women and girls are the most at risk and the most affected by gender-based violence, boys, men, and gender minorities also experience gender-based violence. It can have serious physical, mental, economic, and social repercussions. For example, sexualized violence can lead to unwanted pregnancies, unsafe abortions, and sexually transmitted infections, as well as isolation and depression. It can also prevent survivors from achieving economic prosperity because of stigma or physical and psychological trauma caused by the violence.

Good Morning all, It is my pleasure to welcome you all to this Youth Summit, thank you for taking time off your busy schedules to join us in this epoch-making occasion. I would like to thank my team members for their support and express my deepest appreciation to all of them for the excellent work in making this summit possible.

Like many other organizations working in the youth care space, we at CYDPAN are committed to realizing our mission statement which is to inspire, equip and empower young people, women and children with accurate information, opportunities and resources towards all facets of development and poverty abatement.

NOW is the time to invest in young people. Now is the time, not sometime in the future. I say now is the time because young people are not just the future; they are very much the present. Yes, the challenges are many. But they are not insurmountable. Together we can overcome them if we work together and redouble our efforts to guarantee that all young people have the knowledge, skills and opportunities to reach their fullest potentials.

Let me say this, we will not achieve any of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) to end extreme poverty, to reach universal education, to improve health, to advance gender equality and create a sustainable planet, unless we make these smart investments in youth and partner with young people.

Investing in young people's education, health and employment will ensure better prospects for their own lives and for their countries' development. On the other hand, if we fail to make these investments now, we will further entrench poverty and ignorance for generations to come.

We have watched with some dismay at the evidence of rapid rise in the vandalization of public assets, sexual crimes against minors, high rate of unemployment and poverty, and the likes. This is indicative of the fact that majority of young people are ignorant of their responsibilities and most of them are economically inactive hence, needing empowerment.

Today's summit is our small first step in the direction of working with all the relevant stakeholders. We hope, with the help of all of you, to set up a road map of actions and the policy framework that can help identify and address various problems facing Nigerian youths. This Summit will feature plenary sessions with high-profiled keynote speakers, interactive breakout sessions involving a range of partners, lots of experts as speakers.

They do this by addressing their situations and then take action in order to improve their access to resources and transform their consciousness through their beliefs, values, and attitudes.
